

#### Overview

- 163 MS offences were recorded across West Yorkshire during Q2 2023 (excl. CSE-related crime) – a slight rise of 2 offences on Q1 2023.
- The majority of offending continues to concern Criminal Exploitation, in particular
  - cannabis cultivation, drug supply and county lines offences.
- An increase in recorded Labour Exploitation offences was observed, this
  is largely due to a recent operation focusing on exploitation in the car
  wash sector.
- There has been a reduction in the number of NRM referrals since Q1 2023.
- A notable decrease in the volume of intelligence in contrast to the previous quarter.

#### Overview

- MS offences have decreased within the Bradford district, from 48 recorded offences (excl. CSE-related crime) in Q1 2023 to 34 recorded offences in Q2 2023. This is largely due to a fall in Criminal Exploitation offences, in particular cannabis cultivation, county lines and drug supply offences.
- The number of NRM referrals have significantly reduced since Q1 2023 with the majority of referrals coming from West Yorkshire Police and Government Agencies.
- · The volume of intelligence has increased since Q1 2023.





### **CL** Emerging threats across West Yorkshire

- Increase in peer-on-per offending, with a large proportion of offenders being recorded as under 18. Indecent Image offences (i.e. take/make/distribute indecent images of children).
- In online offences, the most frequently used platforms are generally Snapchat, Whatsapp, Instagram, and Facebook. Omegle, TikTok, and Discord also feature in a number of reports.
- Young people's bank accounts being used for money laundering.
- Nationally an increase in young males experiencing CSE and young females in CCE.
- Use of cuckooed properties across districts.



### MSHT Emerging threats across West Yorkshire

- Sex worker exploitation, particularly Brazilian, Paraguayan and Romanian victims.
- Students forced into labour exploitation as part of their 'visa requirements' and vulnerable to financial exploitation.
- Cannabis farms particularly Vietnamese and Albanian victims.
- Care, construction, restaurants, nail bars, car washes and factories vulnerable to forced labour practice.
- Increase in domestic servitude.


